Subject and Object Pronouns A pronoun is a word that replaces a noun. *I, you, he, she, it, we,* and *they* are subject pronouns. *Me, you, him, her, it, us,* and *them* are object pronouns. Use a subject pronoun as the subject of a sentence or after forms of *be*. Use an object pronoun as the object of an action verb or after words like *to, for,* or *with*.
