Should It Be *I* or *Me*?

Using *I* and *Me* Use *I* as the subject of a sentence and after forms of *be*. Use *me* after action verbs and after words like *to*, *in*, *for*, and *with*. When using the pronouns *I* and *me* with nouns or other pronouns, name yourself last.

Incorrect: Jack and me went to the movies.

Incorrect: I and Jack went to the movies.

Correct: Jack and I went to the movies.

Incorrect: That was a treat for Jack and I.

Incorrect: That was a treat for me and Jack.

Correct: That was a treat for Jack and me.
